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The Nordic Master programme is a new, high-profile Nordic Council of Ministers' initiative to internationalise higher education, improve student mobility and attract talented students to the Region.

The minimum of three Nordic Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) are needed to form a consortium and apply to the Council of Ministers for funding of up to DKK 1,100,000 for the planning and start-up phases of a programme.

To date, 18 Nordic Master programmes have been set up. They cover a wide range of academic disciplines, and involve 40 HEIs. Mobility is a key component, and most students spend at least six months at two or more partner universities during the two-year programme, which has proven attractive to both Nordic (40%) and non-Nordic students (60%).

Up to 70% of current students say that they particularly liked the idea

of studying in more than one Nordic country. They also feel that the programme will be valuable for them in their future careers.

The Nordic Council of Ministers' funding has been crucial for HEIs wishing to establish new joint or dual degrees.
